






I will be decisive. I will work hard, complete my goals, and obey the rules so that I can win the trophy.









Character Counts!

Being **decisive** is making all decisions based on the perfect will of God. Word Building PACE 1050 illustrates Mr. Trueword telling the students about the character trait trophy a student can have in his office for a week by displaying decisiveness in his life. J. Michael returns to his office and wants to be decisive by working hard, completing his goals, and obeying the rules so that he may earn the privilege of having the trophy in his office.

Throughout Scripture we see illustrations of those who were decisive. Moses demonstrated decisiveness throughout his life. As Israel was ready to enter the Promised Land and Moses was ready to pass off the scene, he called the people together and declared, "I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore, CHOOSE LIFE, that both thou and thy seed may live." (Deuteronomy 30:19) Similarly at the end of his life, Joshua called all of Israel together and asked them for a decisive commitment. "And if it seem evil unto you to serve the LORD, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD." (Joshua 24:15)

One may wonder if he has sufficient wisdom needed to make decisive choices. James says, "If any of you lack wisdom, let him **ask of God**,

that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him." God is concerned for every detail of the Believer's life, so one should not hesitate to ask Him for needed wisdom. James continues by saying to "ask in **FAITH**, nothing wavering." The one who wavers "is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. **A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.**" (James 1:5–8) A double minded man is one who serves two masters. Jesus said, "No man can serve two masters . . . Ye cannot serve God and mammon." (Matthew 6:24)

In another character strip from English PACE 1027, Pastor Alltruth is preaching and God moves upon the heart of Mr. Loyalton, Racer's dad, to respond to the invitation. He walks forward and accepts Jesus Christ into his heart. That is a decisive commitment of eternal value. Jesus said in Matthew 11:28, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Like Mr. Loyalton, many people may be seeking the Lord. Mr. Loyalton responded and was saved. Paul (Saul) was on the Damascus Road when he saw a great light, and Jesus said to him, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?" (Acts 9:4) Paul (Saul) was convicted and made a decisive commitment to follow Jesus that day. Do you need to make that commitment? If so, be decisive and make that commitment today!

Remembering Gladys G. April 19, 1949–October 6, 2021



In the early days of October 2021, the A.C.E. family lost a beloved friend, colleague, and sister in Christ when she left this earth to meet the God she loved. Gladys assisted in establishing Canaan Christian Community, which consists of a church, medical clinic, orphanage, and school using the A.C.E. program.

Gladys was born and raised in Haiti, but due to political unrest and social tensions, she fled to the United States at the age of 15. Attending college, she became a nurse and worked for the next 20 years at a hospital in the United States. Although staying in the United States would have likely been the easiest path to follow, Gladys chose instead to return to her home country and to her fellow countrymen to share with them the love of Christ.

Thirty years ago, with the encouragement and support of a school in Canada, Gladys' church began a school using the A.C.E. program—Canaan Christian School. She also assisted in opening an orphanage and a medical clinic.

The clinic of Canaan Christian Community not only cares for their orphans but also the impoverished residents of the surrounding areas. Servicing 50 to 75 patients a day, the clinic consists of exam rooms, treatment areas, and a pharmacy. The clinic is operated predominantly by Haitian personnel consisting of 2 to 3 doctors, 4 to 5 nurses, and several other support staff.

The orphans attend Canaan Christian School where they are cared for and loved, being brought up in the ways and admonition of the Lord. Canaan Christian Community states about the orphans, "If they don't have a family, they will find one here."

Canaan Christian School is a trilingual school, using French, English, and Haiti's native language of Creole. The school consists of over 100 students from the community, church, and orphanage, many of which are dual enrolled with Lighthouse Christian Academy. For 30 years the school has continued because of faithful servants who have sponsored or made donations to ministries in third world countries.

Gladys was a great blessing to the A.C.E. ministry. Not only had her school attained Quality Status, but she also hosted A.C.E. staff at her school to conduct trainings for other Haitian schools using the A.C.E. program. Several graduates have earned LCA diplomas as well.

In the summer of 2010, the A.C.E. Service Adventure was allowed to use Canaan Christian School as their home base, and in 2013 Gladys became the coordinator for A.C.E. Haiti. Throughout the years, she was the host of many Christian Educators' Conventions. Canaan Christian Community has been a beacon of light and hope to schools in Haiti using the A.C.E. program, providing comfort, aid, and support during natural disasters and political turmoil.

Not only will the A.C.E. family miss Gladys, but her family, friends, and the people of her Haitian ministry will as well. A.C.E. asks that you keep Canaan Christian Community in your prayers as they face forward in this new chapter of ministry. A.C.E. School of Tomorrow is grateful for Gladys' love and support for both the ministry of A.C.E and her native country of Haiti.


Through a two-week summer mission trip, they can join participants from different countries to come together for one purpose—to serve the Lord by assisting schools in need.
